3 myths regarding blood and bloody materials:

1. Soiled & saturated items can be thrown in the garbage. *False*

Saturated items are considered infectious waste by law and must be incinerated in a federally approved facility; it can't just go in the garbage.

2. Once blood has dried, it is safe from viruses and diseases. *False*

HIV and some strains of Hepatitis can remain viable in dried blood up to 30 days.

3. Blood and body fluids can be cleaned from carpeting. *False*

Carpet fibers are hollow and wick blood and body fluids to the carpet pad and subfloor beneath. Only removal of the carpeting, pad and sometimes the subfloor ensures no infectious pathogens remain.
